

CHURCHILL

"Der Präsident der Vereinigten Staaten und ich selbst haben wiederholt festgestellt: Die Erzwingung bedingungsloser Kapitulation befreit die Siegermächte in keiner Weise von ihren Verpflichtungen gegenüber der Menschheit oder von ihren Pflichten als zivilisierte und christliche Völker.

Wir rufen unsern Feinden jetzt zu: Wir fordern bedingungslose Kapitulation, aber ihr wisst, dass wir uns enge moralische Grenzen gesetzt haben, die wir nicht überschreiten werden.

Wir rotten keine Nationen aus. Wir schlachten keine Völker hin. Aber wir lassen uns nichts abhandeln. Ihr habt keine Ansprüche an uns. Ihr müsst bedingungslos kapitulieren. Unsere Sitten und unsere Wesensart werden unsere Handlungen bestimmen.

Wenn ihr jetzt kapituliert, wird die Nachkriegszeit für euch bei weitem nicht so schwer sein wie ein volles Kriegsjahr 1945.

Der Friede wird auf der Grundlage bedingungsloser Kapitulation erfolgen. Aber auch so wird er Deutschland und Japan sofortige, ungeheure Erleichterungen der Leiden und Qualen bringen, die ihnen sonst bevorstehen.

Wir Alliierten sind keine Ungeheuer. Wir sind ehrenhafte Menschen. Wir wollen Fackelträger der Zukunft sein.

Unser Streben geht dahin, aus dem blutigen Chaos, in das die Menschheit nun gestürzt ist, eine neue Welt erstehen zu sehen — eine Welt des Friedens, der Freiheit, des Rechts, der Gerechtigkeit — und ein System, das der ganzen Welt dauernde, unbedrohte Sicherheit schenken soll."

CHURCHILL

"The president of the United States and myself have repeatedly established that our demand for an unconditional surrender will not in any way free us of our duties to humanity as a civilized and Christian nation.

We call now on our enemies to capitulate unconditionally but we also set for ourselves very tight moral limitations, which we will strictly adhere to. We do not intend to destroy this nation, nor eliminate its people, but we will not accept any compromise to our demands.

We owe you nothing and you must surrender unconditionally but you will be treated fair and in a human way.

If you surrender now, than things will be much better after the war than if we have to carry on the war to the end of 1945.

The peace will depend on unconditional surrender but it should be clear to Germany and Japan that many lives and much suffering will be avoided than if the war was to carry on to its bitter end.

The allied forces are not monsters but our honorable people and we want to be the torchbearer of the future.

It is our intention to change the bloody chaos in which mankind is now embroiled in to a new world of peace, freedom, justice, which will give the world continuing security and peace for all people."

THE LEAFLETS

ROOSEVELT

"Was Deutschland betrifft, diese tragische Nation, die den Wind gesät und den Sturm geerntet hat, so sind wir und unsere Verbündeten uns völlig einig darüber, dass wir mit den Nazi-Verschwörern nicht verhandeln oder ihnen auch nur die geringste – offene oder geheime – Verfügung über die Machtmittel der Regierung belassen werden.

Wir werden ihnen keinen einzigen Bestandteil militärischer Macht — oder möglicher militärischer Macht — lassen.

Aber ich wäre der Grundlage meiner religiösen und politischen Überzeugung untreu, wenn ich jemals die Hoffnung und den Glauben aufgeben würde, dass in allen Völkern ohne Ausnahme ein Sinn für Wahrheit, eine Neigung zur Gerechtigkeit und eine Sehnsucht nach Frieden lebt — wenn sie auch im Falle der Deutschen unter einem brutalen Regime verschüttet sein mögen.

Wir erheben keine Anklage gegen die Deutschen an sich, denn wir können nicht glauben, dass Gott eine Menschenrasse auf ewig verdammt hat, und wir wissen, wie viele gute Männer und Frauen deutscher Abstammung in unserem Lande sich als treue, freiheitsliebende und friedliche Bürger erwiesen haben.

Alle in Deutschland, die für diese Tragödie der Menschheit unmittelbar verantwortlich sind, werden streng bestraft werden.

Das deutsche Volk wird nicht versklavt werden, denn die Vereinten Nationen treiben keinen Sklavenhandel. Aber die Deutschen werden sich ihren Rückweg in die Gemeinschaft der friedliebenden und das Recht achtenden Nationen verdienen müssen. Und wir werden bestimmt dafür sorgen, dass sie auf diesem steilen Wege nicht dadurch behindert werden, dass sie Gewehre tragen. Von dieser Bürde werden sie befreit werden - wir hoffen, für immer."

ROOSEVELT

"As regards to Germany, this tragic nation, which has sown the wind and reaped the whirlwind, we and our allies completely agree that we won't carry on negotiations with the Nazi conspirators nor we do have the intension to leave them the slightest disposition for instruments of power (neither frankly nor confidential).

We won't leave them constituent military power or military power opportunities.

But I would be disloyal to my religious and political basic principles when I ever give up the hope and the faith that in all nations exceptional exists a sense of truth, an affection of justice and the desire for peace - although in the case of the German - it is blocked due to the bestical regiment.

We do not press charges against the German as we cannot believe that God damns a human race for ever and we know how many good men and women of German descent lives in our country are loyal, freedom loving and peaceful citizens.

All people in Germany who are directly responsible for this humanity tragedy will be strictly punished.

We won't enslave the German people, as the United Nations don't make slave trade. But the German have to deserve their way back into the community of peace loving nations and nations who respect the right. And we definitely will make sure that the won't be disabled from this liability on this steep way by carrying rifles. Than they will be freed of this liability - we hope for ever."
